

### About The Event

Meet the Funders (MtF) is an innovative year-long programme that strengthens community work in Cornwall. We support projects that address poverty, exclusion, isolation, and rurality.

We believe that the best people to develop flourishing communities are the communities themselves and that faith groups in Cornwall are often at the very heart of that!

MtF begins this year on the 25th and 26th of May with our Spring Event. These days are an opportunity for Cornish projects seeking funding to meet and network with a large number of local and national funders.

The days will be hosted by the Bishop of St Germans, the Rt Revd Hugh Nelson, and Donna Birrell, Vice-Chair of Churches Together in Cornwall.

The event is supported by a series of smaller community workshops. The workshops take participants through the key stages of developing, funding, and sustaining a community social action project.

Meet the Funders is open to people and projects of all faiths and none. The programme is run as a partnership between Transformation Cornwall and the Diocese of Truro.

## Event Focus: Sustainability

Last year the focus for Meet the funders was 'Living Today with Tomorrow in Mind' and this year our event theme is sustainability.

Let's explore the concept of sustainability in relation to the projects and work that we are involved with.

Sustainability is: 'The ability to continue at a particular level for a period of time 'the ability to be maintained at a certain rate or level'

In short, sustainability is the continuation of existence, resting on the pillars of social action, environmental impact, and economic growth.

As times are getting more difficult on all the fronts of our lives; wellbeing, climate emergency, energy, housing, living wages, medical access, financial poverty, people are becoming more reliant on the VCSE sector to bring relieve, connection and hope.

The importance of sustainability is the ability to respond to change. The adaptation of ways to meet the needs in new and innovative ways, changing our method of work in response to the changes around us. Keeping in touch what the needs are and listening to the voices on how to meet the needs.

This means we must be relevant and flexible whilst staying focused on your vision.

Joff has been working in church ministry in Cornwall for the last 11 years, helping to lead the Tubestation Church in Polzeath for 9 years, and now working for All Saints Church in Truro as their Social Justice Missioner. His passions includes surfing, music, theology, Jesus and Cornwall. These passions have lead him to create community gardens, creation care groups, a café social enterprise, being an Acts 435 advocate and guest lecturer with South West Youth Ministries, whilst always being passionate about discipling and caring for his local community.

#### Miranda Lawrance-Owen and Judith Ayers





Judith is a Reader and recent Church Warden and Miranda has been Church Warden for a number of years at St Sampson's Church, South Hill, East Cornwall. We are Joint project co-ordinators.

A few years ago we realised St Sampson's needed a toilet and also had some big

restoration issues. We walked around the church with a clipboard and thought big. Following that we attended our first meet the funders day expecting to learn how to raise the £500,000 we needed. What we came away with was a renewed way of thinking. We were told that we didn't have a building project but a mission project and that has underpinned all we have done and shaped the way we do things.

It has and continues to be a steep learning curve. We have now raised £220,000, mostly from grants and donations and some work has been completed. Neither of us had done anything on this scale before, and the help of professionals and those that have trod this path before us has been essential.

St Sampson's is bucking the trend in that we are seeing growth in the congregation, we meet all our day to day expenses, we have increased community involvement and have supporters around the globe. We have discovered unknown history and made many new friends.
