Donate your rebate to help local people this winter

Transformation Cornwall has teamed up with The Diocese of Truro, The Cornwall and Isles of Scilly Methodist District and Cornwall Faith Forum to encourage residents to donate our energy rebates to Poverty Hurts, the Cornwall Community Foundation's cost of living appeal. Inspiration for the campaign came from Canon Alan Bashforth, whose congregation members at Truro Cathedral asked him how they could use their rebate to help local people facing hardship this winter.

Households are set to receive a total of £400 of energy support but there is no minimum donation amount. The aim is to inspire thousands of locals to share just part of our rebate and make a tangible difference in our own community. Bishop Hugh Nelson, Chair of Transformation Cornwall, said "This campaign is in the true spirit of 'One and All'. For many people the support that's coming for energy bills is desperately needed and won't be enough. Others don't need the help and will be able to donate their rebate. If we all pull together like this, we can make a real difference and make sure people get the support they need. Please give all you can!"
