

Residents in Bradford struggling to make ends meet during the coronavirus pandemic are being urged not to turn to loan sharks.

The <u>Stop Loan Sharks</u> team have issued a warning amid concerns loan sharks now may be looking to take advantage of those who have found themselves in a vulnerable position during the pandemic and feel they have nowhere to turn for help.

A loan shark is someone who lends money without the correct permission from the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA).

Loan sharks are unregulated, often give cash loans without any paperwork and charge extortionate interest rates. They may offer what appears to be a quick-fix small loan, but in the long term, any money borrowed will come at a very high price and may lead to violence, threats and intimidation.

Fraudsters are trying to take advantage of the current situation, so make sure you're on the lookout for anything suspicious.

Refunds: beware texts and emails offering refunds, payments or money into your account or special products to help with Coronavirus.

Protect Yourself: Never give your pin or full password over the phone or click on links in an email and better to log onto the website direct.

Test and Trace: Fraudsters have set up fake NHS websites and calls. NHS contact tracers will call you from 0300 013 5000 or send you a text message from 'NHS'. NHS contact tracers will never ask you to make any form of payment or purchase a product of any kind and they won't ask for details about your bank account.

Three Simple Steps:

- * If you feel pressured, put the phone down
- * Don't make any snap decisions.
- * Do your own checks or ask Friends and family
