#### FEAST OF FUN - SUMMER 2023:

Feast of Fun activities provided almost 4,000 meals for children and their families across the Diocese of Liverpool area, to help tackle holiday hunger.

Together Liverpool distributed 19 grants for Feast of Fun events to 12 churches and their partners across the Diocese of Liverpool, for activities during summer 2023, as part of our Network of Kindness initiative.

The fund supports churches to strengthen relationships with local communities by hosting fun days and barbeques, holiday clubs, and activity sessions.

A total 2,139 people took part in the activities, including 1,248 children and 891 adults. Of the activities:

- 95% engaged with families in receipt of free school meals
- 95% engaged with single parent households
- 68% engaged with BAME households
- 42% engaged with Asylum seekers and refugees
- 11% engaged with LGBTQ+ young people or families
- 26% engaged with children with parents in prison

### Case Study

### St Michael in the City & Faiths4Change



Faiths4Change together with St Michael in the City, hosted two events at The Secret Garden in Stoneycroft, Liverpool.

At a Pick Your Own Lunch morning participants harvested vegetables and made 'Rainbow Wraps' as part of a healthy lunch.

This was followed by a 'Grow Your Own Food' event, when guests were taught gardening tips, got to plant their own seeds, and enjoyed a cooked meal with a recipe card to take home.

Sixty people were fed over the two events, with any leftover fresh vegetables being taken home by the families from the local community.

Rachel Hardy, Food, Land & Wellbeing Coordinator at Faiths4Change said: "The best thing about the activity was being able to provide completely free outdoor activities and food for families to enjoy during the holidays in their neighbourhood."

"It was very successful with over 30 people joining us for craft and gardening activities, as well as the opportunity to pick their own veg and see where the ingredients for our 'Rainbow Wraps' come from!

### **Case Study**

### Christ Church Norris Green with Triple C

More than 1,110 meals were provided to children through Triple C at Christ Church Norris Green's 2 week play scheme. Children enjoyed healthy meals throughout each day including breakfast, snacks and lunch.

Children also enjoyed craft activities, team games and visits from the fire brigade and a mini zoo. The scheme engaged children from families in receipt of school meals and single parent households.

### **Case Study**

### Liverpool N. Central Methodist Circuit

Liverpool North Central Methodist Circuit got people active with a 'Let's Get Moving!' day.

Activities included decorating water bottles, plenty of games to get both children and parents moving, and finished with a healthy lunch. The session highlighted the importance of staying active, bringing together the church with the community.

### **Case Study**

### St James with St Thomas, Wigan West

St James with St Thomas, Wigan West supplied lunches to families during holidays, providing more than 100 meals.

In partnership with Wigan Athletic, football club, the children were treated to a tour of the stadium and match day tickets. The scheme established links between local organisations and the church.

### **Big Day Out**

#### Christ Church, Walton Breck

In addition to Feast of Fun, we supported two Big Day Out activities run by Christ Church, Walton Breck, each with a grant of £500.

Over 50 local children enjoyed two days out to Martin Mere Wildfowl and Wetlands Centre, and Walton Hall Gardens.

They discovered wildlife through pond dipping and insect catching, and enjoyed a variety of outdoor games. A particular highlight for both trips was enjoying a picnic lunch together.

These events helped to build and strengthen relationships between the church and community groups over the summer break. It also provided the children with the opportunity to visit somewhere that would not usually be available to them.
