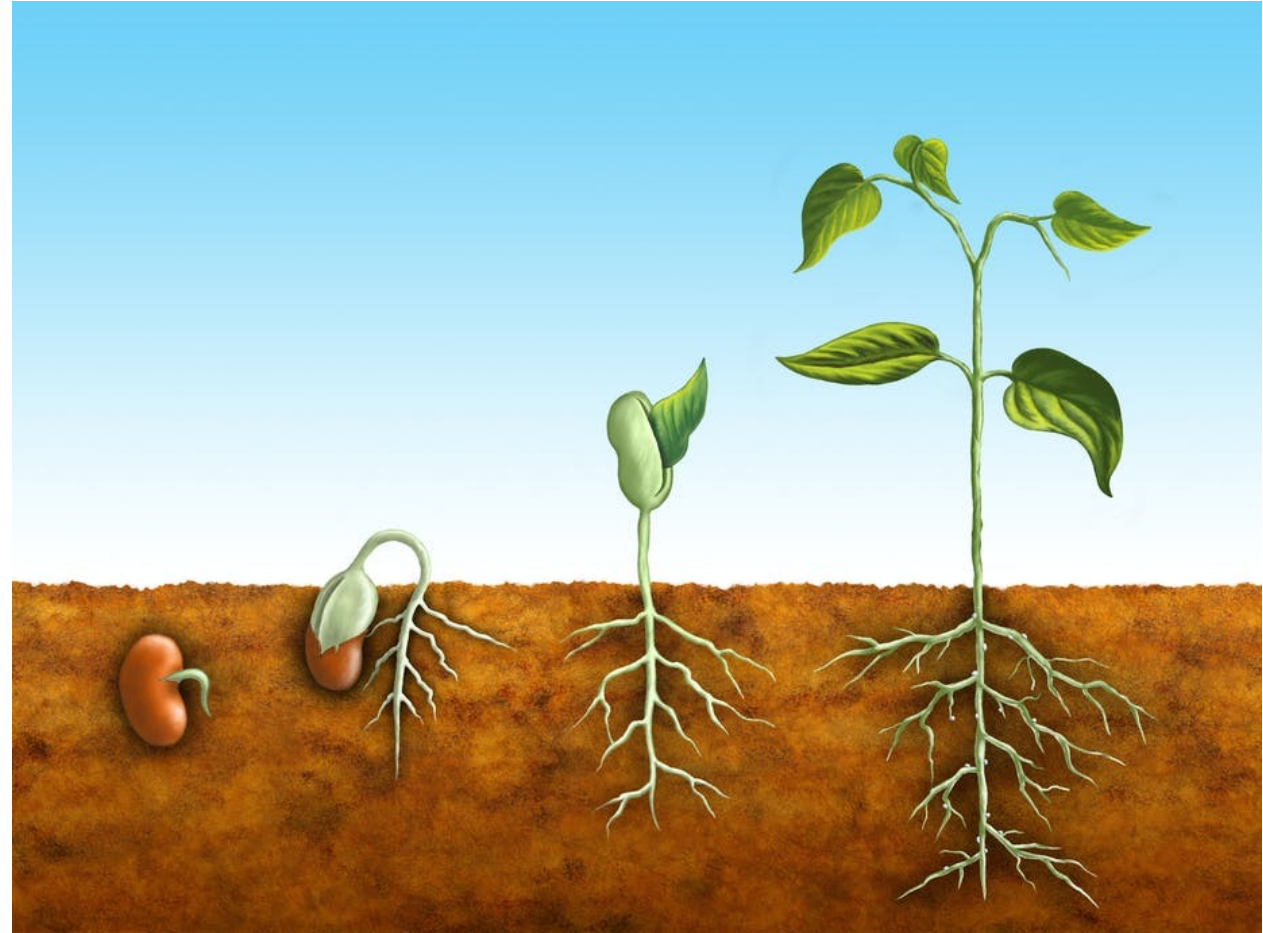

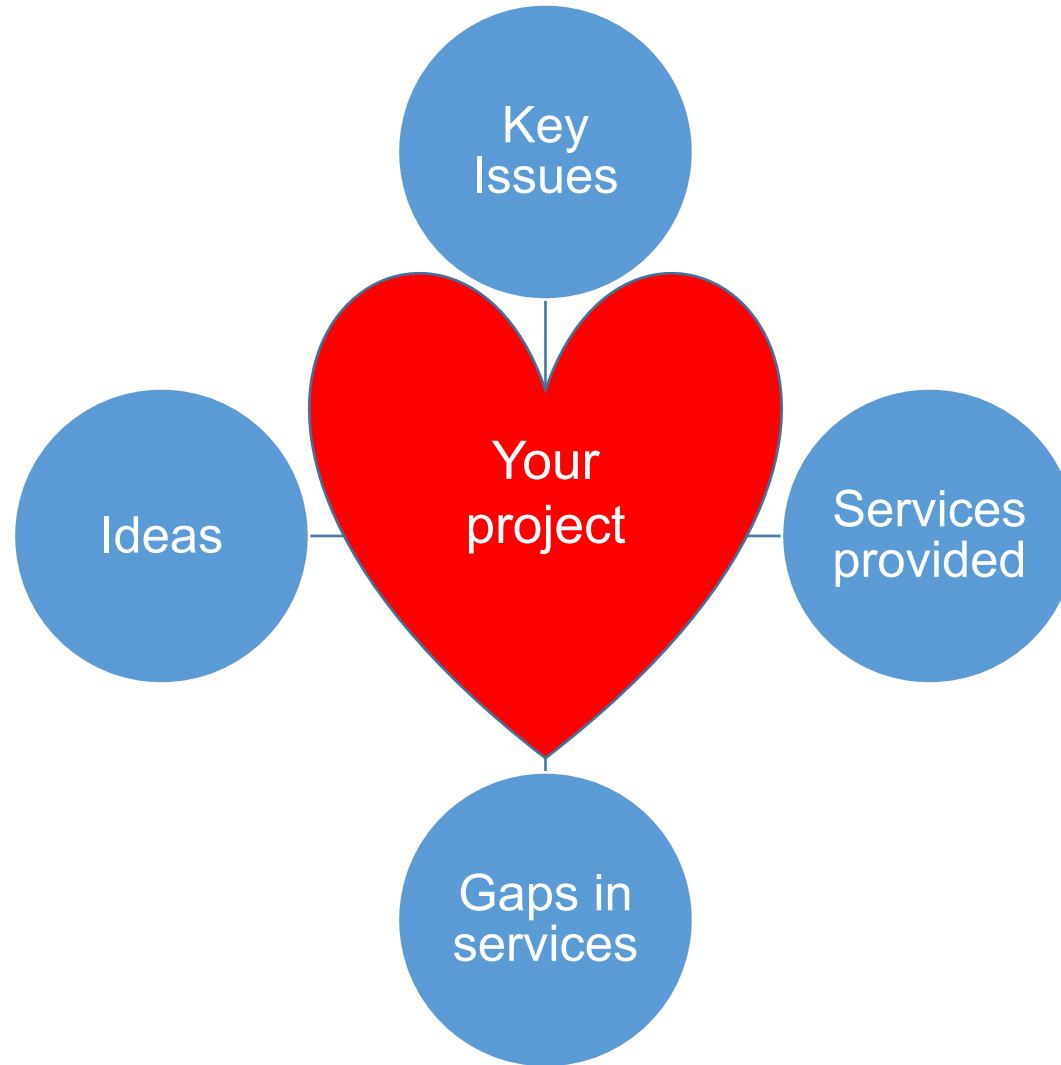

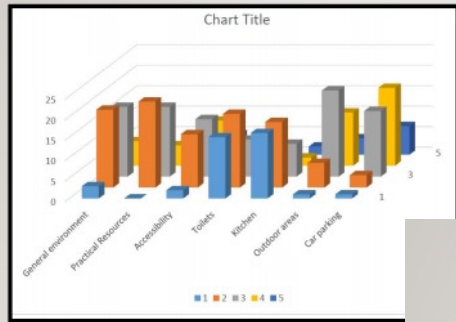

From 48 responses, areas such as the kitchens and toilets scored very low when people were asked what they thought present reality. As did General



We surveyed the new Penn an Dre estate again to hear what they thought.

When asked about the main concerns for their community they said (in priority order):

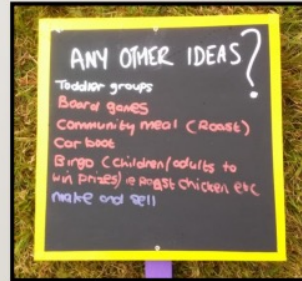
- Building a sense of community
- Older people living alone
- Family life
- Children and young people
- Physical fitness and health
- Mental and Emotional Wellbeing
- Spiritual Wellbeing
- Financial advice and support

We asked the local community what they really wanted from their community hub.

at a special Summer Community Event (2nd July 2016)

From surveys we heard the community ask for...

- A Youth Club (11-16yo)
- Afterschool club (6-10yo)
- Outdoor space for family activities
- Adult learning support*** (frequent answer)
- Evening classes such as Pilates and Yoga
- us to help build a better sense of community
- Cooking Club
- Community Café** (frequent answer)



We asked every group using All Saints what would really help them.

17 replies from 24 invitations – at a special Community Forum event 7th May 2016

- Shared office space
- Smaller meeting rooms.
- Open and welcoming spaces such as Community Café
- One large multipurpose meeting space
- Better storage facilities for Foodbank and Clothing bank
- Better lighting, energy efficiency and a/v facilities.
