



Meet the Funders (MtF) is an innovative year-long programme that strengthens community work and builds capacity across the Voluntary and Faith sectors in Cornwall. We support projects that address poverty, exclusion, isolation, and rurality.

We believe that the best people to develop flourishing communities are the communities themselves, whether you are an individual, church, faith group, charity, social enterprise, we are here to support you.

MtF begins this year on the 25th April with our Spring Event. This is an opportunity for projects across Cornwall seeking funding to meet and network with a large number of local and national funders.

The day will be hosted by the Bishop of St Germans, the Rt Revd Hugh Nelson, and Donna Birrell, Vice-Chair of Churches Together in Cornwall.

The event will be supported by a series of smaller community workshops throughout the year. The workshops take participants through the key stages of developing, funding, and sustaining a community social action project.

Meet the Funders is open to people and projects of all faiths and none. The programme is run as a partnership between Transformation Cornwall and the Diocese of Truro.







Celebrating the Faith and Voluntary Sectors

Last year the focus for Meet the Funders was 'Sustainability' and this year our event theme is 'Celebrating the Faith and Voluntary sectors'.

Sustainability remains a key element in project design, delivery and impact; so keep this in mind when planning and seeking funding for your project.

Sustainability is: 'The ability to continue at a particular level for a period of time 'the ability to be maintained at a certain rate or level'

As the pressure of austerity and cost-of-living crisis continues to impact our county, notably, the most vulnerable, reliance and pressure on the VCSE sector increases. This is why we must celebrate the work you are doing, support you in your fight for justice within our communities, and develop sustainable projects that empower our county.

The importance of sustainability is the ability to adapt our ways of working, ensuring our work is relevant to the need and the impact has a lasting outcome. We are so fortunate in Cornwall to have such a vast network of faith and voluntary groups committed to alleviating poverty and deprivation, and it is our hope that you continue this journey in partnership with one another. FEAST harnesses the many talents and energies of Cornwall and Isles of Scilly's artists and communities to create inspiring opportunities for people to come together and enjoy high-quality arts as participants and audiences. They support artists to work with community volunteers to launch or invigorate local festivals and events and to open new doors for people to explore their own creativity. FEAST also works with partner organisations to offer new creative ways of tackling some of the social, economic or environmental issues facing Cornwall and Isles of Scilly.



Resonance

Resonance is a social impact property fund manager. Launched in 2002 with the mission of connecting capital to social enterprise.

They are proud to be a B Corp and of their 20-year track record of impact investing. They provide life changing homes and solutions for people and communities facing crisis. Through their pioneering social impact residential property funds, they work with institutional investors and expert housing partners to provide safe, affordable homes with wrap around support. Since their first property fund launched in 2013, they have helped to provide homes for almost 3,000 individuals and families in over 1,000 properties, in major cities across the UK.



Benefact Trust

Benefact Trust exists to make a positive difference to people's lives by funding, guiding and celebrating the work of churches and Christian charities; empowering the most vulnerable and giving people, communities and places a renewed opportunity to flourish.



Duchy Health Charity

Duchy Health Charity provides strategic and financial support for focused organisations to create effective health and wellbeing solutions for the people of Cornwall. Since it's inception it has given out over £9m of grant funding to smaller health and wellbeing related charities for the benefit of those living in Cornwall.



Cornwall Community Foundation (CCF)

Cornwall Community Foundation
helps to build stronger communities
by encouraging local giving. All the
money they raise supports
volunteer-led, grassroots
community groups across Cornwall
and the Isles of Scilly. Their mission
is to make sustainable funding

National Lottery Heritage Fund

The National Lottery Heritage Fund, distributes National Lottery grants from £10,000 to £10million and over, funding projects that sustain and transform the UK's heritage. They distribute funding on behalf of the UK and devolved governments to heritage organisations. They provide leadership and support across the heritage sector, and advocate for the value of heritage.

Cornwall Women's Fund

As a giving circle Cornwall Women's Fund is harnessing the power of individuals to invest together and meet local need in our communities. As a network they share knowledge, understanding and the responsibility of deciding which organisations to support. They run a grant scheme to improve lives and a programme of events to inspire women and girls. They are hosted by Cornwall Community Foundation who administer the fund on their behalf.



Cornwall Historic Churches Trust (CHCT)

The Cornwall Historic Churches
Trust assists in the restoration
and repair of Cornish churches
which have architectural or
historic merit. Whilst the Trust
has limited capital and
resources available, churches
and chapels of all
denominations are eligible to
apply for assistance.



The Asda Foundation

The Asda Foundation supports small, grass roots organisations in several ways throughout the year. Working with Asda's Community Champions in store, they are able to work with a range of organisations and groups on a variety of local community projects.



Good Growth Shared Prosperity Fund

As part of the UK Government's Levelling Up agenda, Cornwall and Isles of Scilly have been allocated £137 million to spend on local investment through the Shared Prosperity Fund. With a focus on green and inclusive growth, they will use their portion to achieve good growth for Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly, providing opportunities for communities and businesses and giving residents access to new jobs and training.



The Coop Foundation

The Co-op's charity are co-operating for a fairer world. They believe co-operation is at the heart of strong communities and this makes them a different kind of funder. They work closely with communities, to listen and learn. They unlock communities' power by focusing on those who have most at stake. They asked young people to shape their vision, and now they are co-operating with them and others to turn this into reality.
