


# WHO ARE WE?


## **OUR GRANTS**

■ **Small** Grants: £500 - £5k (exceptionally up to £10k)

- maintenance/repair projects up to £20k

- Medium Grants: Up to £10k
  - project development up to RIBA Stage 1
  - essential repairs costing £20k to £80k
- Large Grants: Up to £50k
  - urgent structural repairs costing over £80k
  - new facilities (kitchens/toilets) over £30k




# WHAT WE DON'T FUND

- > 30% of applications are ineligible at the outset
- > We cannot fund:
  - > Heating, lighting, electricity or audio-visual equipment
  - Work to fixtures and fittings e.g. clocks, organs, bells, monuments
  - Restoration of decorative features, e.g. wall paintings, stained glass
  - > Work to churchyards, boundary walls, car parks, paths, etc
  - ➤ New builds or separate structures

### National Lottery Heritage Fund (formerly the Heritage Lottery Fund) ♂

### Garfield Weston Foundation ☑

This foundation gives grants for reordering church buildings in order to give greater flexibility of use, including assistance with disabled access. It also helps fund creating kitchen and toilet facilities. Applications are considered on an individual basis monthly. It normally takes three or four months for an application to be processed.


### Benefact Trust ☑ (Formerly Allchurches Trust)

This funder responds to requests for financial assistance from Anglican churches, churches of other denominations and the wider Christian community. The Trust supports appeals from churches for building and restoration projects, repair of church fabric, church community initiatives, religious charities, charities preserving the UK heritage and other charitable causes.

### Landfill Communities Fund ☑

Since 1996 Landfill Operators can choose to re-direct part of their tax bill to local communities near landfill sites rather than paying it to the Treasury. The funds are distributed through Environmental Bodies (such as WREN, Veolia Trust, Suez Communities Trust, Biffa, Viridor Credits, Cory Environmental etc) which able to support the repair and wider community use of historic places of worship. Check postcode eligibility on each individual own website, or search funds available at ENTRUST .






# **ELIGIBILITY**


Every application starts with an eligibility quiz

- ✓ Located in the UK
- ✓ Originally built as a place of worship (over 30 years ago) and open for regular public worship
- ✓ Open at least <u>100</u> days per year or within 1 year of completion
- ✓ Work not yet started
- ✓ At least 50% funds raised
- ✓ Leading qualified professional with <u>conservation</u> <u>accreditation</u> if listed
- ✓ Necessary <u>permissions</u> and <u>multiple quotes</u> in place



# **SMALL GRANTS**

- Awards of £500 to £5,000 (exceptionally up to £10,000)
- Maintenance and repair projects up to £20,000
- E.g. small roof repairs, repointing, repairs to rainwater goods
- Work identified in recent Five Year Inspection
   Report/survey report
- 2 quotes
- Permissions
- Support from lead professional (CA)
- Maintenance plan
- Deadline every 2 months




# MEDIUM GRANTS (Project Development)

- Awards up to £10,000
- Project development up to RIBA Stage 1
- E.g. feasibility studies, option appraisals, detailed reports
  - to better understand an issue
- 2 quotes and 50% funds for this element
- Support from lead professional (CA)
- 3 decision rounds




# MEDIUM GRANTS (Repair)

- Awards up to £10,000
- Essential repairs costing £20,000 to £80,000
- E.g. roof repairs, masonry repairs, rainwater goods –
   ideally identified in a recent Five Year Inspection
   Report/survey
- Permissions, 2 quotes and 50% funds in place
- Conservation accredited lead professional
- 3 decision rounds per year



# **LARGE GRANTS**

- Awards up to £50,000
- Urgent structural repairs costing over £80,000
- New facilities (kitchens & accessible toilets) over £30,000
- Two stage Process
- Tendered or QS Costs and 50% funding in place
- Permissions
- Conservation Accredited Professional if church is listed
- 3 decision rounds per year







# We support a variety of churches, chapels and meeting houses across the United Kingdom with our grants programmes.

Our grants are available to any Christian place of worship in the UK that is open for regular worship.

They help keep church buildings in good repair, open for worship and community activities, and allow them to continue to serve people, communities and visitors in all sorts of ways.

Whether you are looking to repair your roof, install a kitchen or accessible toilets, clear asbestos or simply need help undertaking regular essential maintenance to your building, we offer a range of grants to suit the size and needs of your project.





### Large grants

Large grants for urgent structural repair projects and for projects to install kitchens and toilets.



### Treasure Ireland grants

Small to medium grants to support church projects in Northern Ireland.



### Medium grants

Medium grants to support urgent repair and maintenance issues as well as project development work.



### Wolfson Fabric Repair Grants

Since 2020, we have managed grants made to churches by the Wolfson Foundation. You can apply for a Wolfson grant via our Large or Medium grants programmes.



### Small grants

Small grants to support small but urgent maintenance and repair issues or to carry out small investigative works.



### Cherish grants

Cherish grants for churches in Scotland,
Wales/Cymru and North West England to carry
out maintenance, urgent repair work or
project development.



# Large grants

Next Stage 1 deadline: 7 November (midnight)

Next Stage 2 deadline: you will be notified of this if you pass Stage 1

Grant size: Up to £50,000°

Works cost: Over £80,000 for urgent repairs; over £30,000 for facilities

This programme offers our largest grants of up to £50,000 towards the cost of major urgent structural repair projects costed at more than £80,000 including VAT.

\*grants of \$40,000 to \$50,000 are extremely limited and reserved for cases which demonstrate a very high case for investment.

We will also consider projects that introduce kitchers and accessible toilets to enable increased community use, costed at more than \$30,000 including VAT Grants will never exceed \$0% of the project cost.

### Introduction

On the following pages you will find the eligibility criteria, programme outcomes, details of how to apply and what supporting documents you will need, some top tips, as well as the terms and conditions of any successful grant application.

The National Churches Trust supports Christian places of worship throughout the United Kingdom that can demonstrate strong community engagement and sound plans for economic viability. Priority is given to projects that demonstrate well-developed plans for the building, that are supported beyond the congregation, and into the future.

### Large grant programme

This programme supports the conservation and sustainable use of church buildings, focusing on larger and more complex projects. Our priority is for funding urgent structural repairs costing more than £80,000 including VAT. The installation of kitchens and accessible toilets costing more than £30,000 including VAT is also elicibles.

The maximum grant under this programme is £50,000. The current average

Grants will only apply to eligible work, but please include the whole phase project costs. Grants will never exceed 50% of the project cost. Offers are valid for two years. Those applying for £50,000 will need to demonstrate a very strong case for investment. We cannot guarantee that if an award is made that your full request will be met.

### Welcome to the National Churches Trust's Grant Application Site

Our grants are available to support work to church buildings throughout the UK that fulfill the eligibility criteria. We can fund maintenance work, repair work, installation of kitchens and accessible toilets, and some project development work. You must have 50% of funds in place, permissions secured and valid (unless yours is a project development scheme), and a qualified professional leading the project (conservation accredited if the building is listed). Our grants will never exceed 50% of the project costs.

As demand regularly exceeds the funds we have available, we have to limit the sorts of projects we can consider. If your project is not eligible we hope that the information on our website with alternative sources of funding, as well as other resources and buildings advice pages, will be helpful to you.


Please note that we place a strong emphasis on maintenance and being open. We encourage all applicants and grantees to have a maintenance plan and require grantees to be open more than 100 days a year and to feature on our Explore map.
