Our funding focus is about connecting or re-connecting people with others in their local community. We support applications from community health professionals, community groups and registered charities that combat isolation and loneliness and enable older people and adults with disabilities to be active and engaged.

We help small community groups and local charities with activities, outings, equipment and materials for members/service users. Our grants range from £100 up to £2,500.

*NB. Barchesters is also listed in our hardship grants for individuals as they also support eligible older people or with a physical or learning disability or mental health problem (through 3rd party referrals).

The Foundation award grants to UK registered charities, CICs, and other registered UK not-for-profit organisations (including special schools). Grants are awarded towards capital projects.

The Foundation fund both large and small projects through their main & small grant programmes. The size of grant awarded will depend on a number of factors including the size of your organisation and the cost and scale of the capital project.

Projects must be able to demonstrate that the work of the organisation fits within one or more of the Foundation programme areas of:
