The support that grassroot community groups have offered in response to the challenges of the current crisis is amazing and many of these local groups have members of faith communities at their heart and as vital volunteers. To support these local groups a series of 19 local community hubs have been established and each of these hubs has a Faith Rep in recognition of the contribution by the Faith Communities. The hubs are there to listen to the issues that are arising on the ground and where necessary to escalate these higher and help bring in extra support if it is needed. Launch of SAM: Social Action Mapping for Cornish Churches

Cornish Churches organise a whole variety of social action projects across the county, some well-known, others less so. The Cinnamon network estimates in its 2016 National Faith Audit that across the UK around 1.8 million volunteers from faith community are providing over 5 million beneficiary interactions, valuing their time at over £3 billion: "We're talking about initiatives that get to the heart of what matters to communities, connect with the messy issues at the centre of people's lives and genuinely make a long term difference."
